At the Yokohama YMCA, Department of Japanese Language Studies, you will be trained thoroughly in all the following four areas of Japanese language; listening, speaking, reading, and writing, aiming to learn genuine Japanese.

Audit Students can participate in some of our classes apart from our regular students

■Type of Courses :

There are three types of Japanese course which audit students may attend, according to the purposes of study and levels of Japanese language. For courses **A** and **B**, the school will issue a certificate of attendance at the end of the studying period.

★This course is aimed for training Japanese language from introduction level to intermediate level. You will be able to master basic Japanese communication skills that will help you in your everyday life.

★This course is aimed for training Japanese language of advanced level.

You will be able to master practical Japanese communication skills that will help secure employment, pursue further studies, and deal with various scenes in your social life.

★This course is aimed for training practical ability for passing the nearest Japanese Language Proficiency Test at the level of N1 and N2.

■**Number of Students Recruiting:** Each course is only limited to a maximum of 20 students.

- For Courses **A** and **B**: 3 periods a day, 5 days a week from Monday to Friday. (15 periods a week, 16 weeks in 6 months.)

■Application Requirements :

- 1) The applicant for course **A** must basically be 15 years old or above and have completed at least 9 years of formal education (equal to junior high school in Japan) in their home country.
- 2) The applicant for course **B** must basically be 18 years old or above and have completed at least 12 years of formal education (equal to high school in Japan), or meets requirements for admission into high education such as universities in their home country.
- 3) All applicant must obtain a valid visa.
- 4) The applicant for course **B** (Japanese and Culture Studying Course) must have a Japanese language ability equivalent to N2 level of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test.

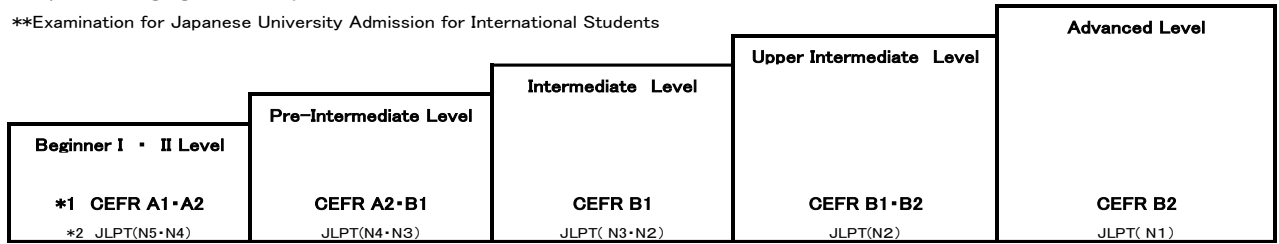

② Photos of the applicant (4cmx3cm)

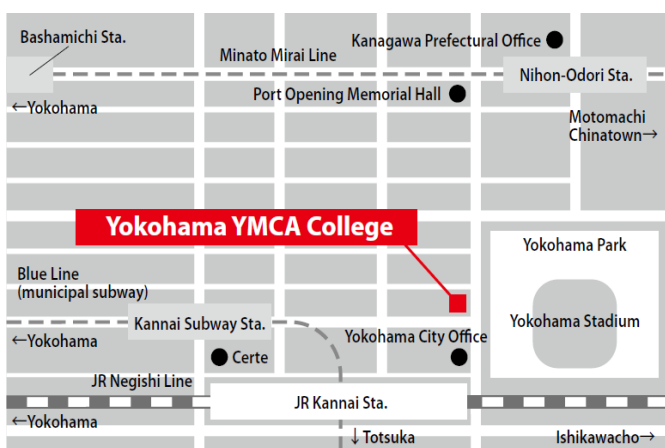
Write your name and birth date on the back of each copy. Attach one photo to the application form.

The school will make photocopies of both sides of the card when receiving application.



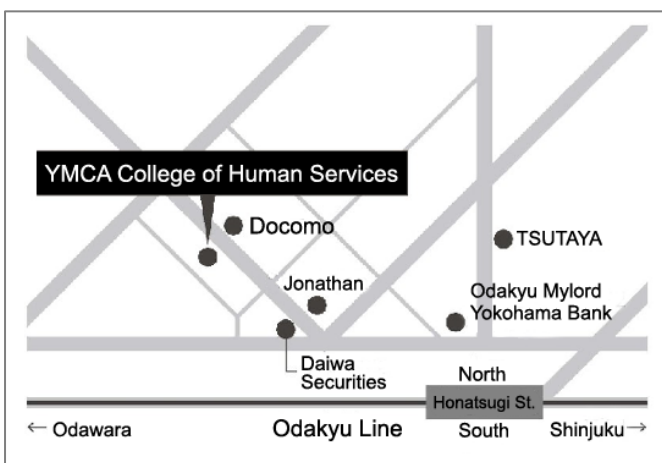
